Evening entertainment in Wrexham

There's something for everyone in the National Eisteddfod's evening concert programme this year, according to organisers, and with just over a month to go before the Eisteddfod starts, there's still time to buy your tickets for the Pink Pavilion's evening programme.

Join us for our memorable opening night on Friday 29 July, with Wales' very own Three Tenors - Rhys Meirion, Aled Hall and Alun Rhys-Jenkins - joined by rising star, Fflur Wyn, Ysgol Morgann Llwyd Choir, and local male voice choirs - what better way to start the week than with an evening of classical favourites and some well known Welsh songs? This concert is sponsored by Wind Power Wales.

Clwyd Theatr Cymru Theatre for Young People has assembled a team of renowned professional artists from Wales, under the direction of Clwyd Theatr Cymru's award-winning director, Tim Baker, to work with Wrexham's young people. The performance on Saturday night, Heno Heno, is inspired by the wonderful book, 'Where Children Sleep' by James Mollison, published by Chris Boot. This concert is supported by the Arts Council of Wales.

Sunday evening is a feast of congregational hymn singing, led by experienced conductor, Geraint Roberts, originally from Wrexham, with Robert Parry on the organ. The Cymania is supported by Radnor Walk Welsh Congregational Church, Chelsea, London.

On Monday evening, join some of Wales' top stars, including Caryl Parry Jones, Huw Chiswell, Elin Fflur, Tecwyn Ifan and Al Lewis Band, as they perform all-time pop classics, by a wide range of composers. Enjoy an evening to remember at the Eisteddfod Pavilion as we hear the best Welsh pop songs ever written. This evening is sponsored by the Post Office.

Wynne Evans, star of the popular Go Compare adverts, Shân Cothi and Llŷr Williams are the stars celebrating both the Eisteddfod's visit to the Wrexham area and the National Eisteddfod's 150th anniversary. Among Tuesday evening's repertoire is a number of Eisteddfod-related well known pieces, so join us for a special evening on the Pavilion stage, with Alwyn Humphreys conducting the Chamber Orchestra of Wales. There's competing on the Pavilion stage on Wednesday and Friday evening, and on Thursday evening, it's time to celebrate that the modern day Eisteddfod is 150 years old this year. 

Maes B
Glyndwr University Campus is the location for this year's Maes B, with two stages offering a mix of music which will reinforce Maes B's important role in the Welsh language music calendar.

Y Niwl opens this year's festival on Saturday 30 July, managing to perform in Wrexham before rejoining Gruff Rhys on his international tour. Dau Cein, Yucatan and Land of Bingo will also perform in the Students Union.


On Monday and Tuesday evenings, it's the Maes B Battle of the Bands competition, with a number of bands from all parts of Wales competing, with a slot on stage at Maes B on the final evening up for grabs. Y Cyfoes, who came third in the competition at last year's Eisteddfod will also perform on the Monday evening, with Breichiau Hud appearing on Tuesday.

From Wednesday night onwards, both stages will be in use as Maes B gets busier, with Meic Stevens, Leuween and Gildas at the Students Union and Elin Fflur, Al Lewis Band and Yr Angen at William Aston Hall.

Yr Ods, Y Bandana and Y Trydan will be in William Aston Hall on Thursday night, with Plant Dduw, Jen Jeniro and Sensegur at the Students Union.

The weekend begins with Acid Casuals' DJ set in the Union with Plyci, Crash Disco!, Cloud4Motions and DJs Electroneg 1000 on Friday night and Cowbois Rhos Botwnnog, Gai Toms and Catrin Herbert in William Aston Hall. Wrexham and District Eisteddfod's Maes B wraps up with Sibrýdion, Masters in France and Violas in William Aston Hall and Colorama, Huw M and Trwbador in the Students Union.

Maes C
This year's Maes C is held at Ysgol Clywedog (the old Bryn Offa School), which is adjacent to the official caravan site on Lower Berse Farm, off Ruthin Road, Wrexham, next to the Maes itself.

The week starts on Saturday 30 July with Dafydd Iwan, Gwyneth Glyn and Aled Wyn's Disco - which is sure to appeal to a wide audience - and perfect for everyone embarking on a full week of Eisteddfod! Following last year's success, Sunday night is a family friendly event, with Bob Delyn a'r Ebillion, the evergreen songs of Cwm Rhyd y Rhosyn with Dafydd Iwan - which are so well-known to generations of children - and Twm Morys will also be performing Welsh nursery rhymes and lullabies.

Sibrýdion and Dyring Evans play a late gig on Monday evening, starting at 21.30. The stage show 'Maes Caryl Parry Jones yn fyw' is on Tuesday evening, and the talented performer and presenter is sure to provide an enjoyable evening full of fun and laughter. Caryl has been part of the Welsh music scene since the 70s, and this is a chance to enjoy her performing some of her classics and sharing some funny stories about her songs.

Barddas and Literature Wales are responsible for Wednesday evening at Maes C. Dai dy Dafod with poets and performers Myrddin ap Dafydd, Ilor ap Glyn, Mei Mae, Twm Morys and Geraint Lovgreen, reliving the oppression and campaigns of the past through poetry and song, as we celebrate half a century since Saunders Lewis' iconic lecture, The Fate of the Language.

Thursday night is a real blast from the past, with Welsh seventies icon, Hywel Ffaiidd, performing a brand new show, especially commissioned for Maes C and written by Meic Povey. Make sure you order your tickets well in advance - they're sure to sell out!

Another evening which will undoubtedly sell out is Friday night - the Stomp, organised by Literature Wales - and the highlight of the week for many Eisteddfodwyr. Maffia Mr Huws bring the week to a close - the Welsh rock giants of the eighties - with Daniel Lloyd, Mr Pinc and DJ Aled Wyn. A great end to a packed week, offering something for people of all ages.
